

The year in review

A foreword from Holly Masters, CEO

While the past few years have been characterised by challenge and uncertainty, the resilient spirit of the McGrath Foundation community has never wavered.

With the generous support of individuals, our partners and Government, this year we have funded 19 new McGrath Breast Care Nurses including 6 metastatic McGrath Breast Care Nurses across the country, whilst also continuing to fund our existing 166 McGrath Breast Care Nurses. This means we now have 185 McGrath Breast Care Nurses providing care right across Australia.

An absolute highlight of the year was announcing our goal of funding 250 nurses by 2025 on International Nurses Day, through a powerful mural depicting McGrath Breast Care Nurse, Jolyene Fletcher and her 26-year-old patient, Emily Quinlan.

Beautifully designed by visual artist Sarah McCloskey, the inspiring work in North Sydney represents more than 20,000 Australians diagnosed with breast cancer each year and our McGrath Breast Care Nurses who support them throughout their experience emotionally, physically and psychologically, from the time of diagnosis and throughout treatment.

The mural was a timely reminder of what is at the heart of the McGrath Foundation – our nurses. With their phenomenal commitment, this year more than 12,500 breast cancer patients and their families nationwide had access to the vital care and support they needed. That is testament to the power of generous support we receive from the Australian

community. None of this would be possible without them.

I feel privileged to lead the exceptional team at the McGrath Foundation and the 185 McGrath Breast Care Nurses who make such a difference to thousands of families across Australia every day.

As one in five people in Australia experiencing breast cancer will miss out on the vital support of a dedicated breast care nurse this year it is more important than ever that we stay focussed on our mission of ensuring no one misses out on care.



Through the work of the McGrath Foundation, 90% of women in Australia now live within 75km of a McGrath Breast Care Nurse, who provide families with the care they need to navigate a breast cancer diagnosis and their treatment.

"Each person has a different support style, but I always bring it back to the patients. We involve patients in their treatment and empower them to make their own decisions. Before becoming a nurse, I didn't realise how much psychological support we provide. It's part of the human relationship – talking, creating connections and supporting them during challenging times."

We're proud to have increased spend on our mission in FY21/22 while keeping our administration costs low.




INCREASE IN MISSION FUNDING

Revenue
